### Preparation

Before you arrive to your first class, there are three things you must have- completed paperwork, completed knowledge reviews, and your own mask, fins, and snorkels. Details on each are below.

#### *Paperwork*

In order to facilitate the progress of class, it is imperative that all students have their paperwork complete. Below is a list of necessary items and where these items can be obtained:

Please have these items with you and completely filled out when you come to your first class. Please go over the medical statement as early as possible- there are medical related questions, if you answer 'yes' to any of them you will need a doctor to sign off that you are OK to dive.

#### *Knowledge Reviews*

In your rescue diver manual there are several chapters, each with a corresponding series of questions called a Knowledge Review. Before arriving to class on Saturday morning you must have read the whole book and completed all the knowledge reviews. You

should have the book and completed knowledge reviews with you on the first evening of class.

### *Gear*

Atlantic Edge Dive Center will provide you with tanks and weights for your training dives. You are responsible for all other gear including mask, fins, snorkel, wetsuit, BC's and regulators. If you do not have this gear, one of our staff members would be happy to help you select a mask, fins, and snorkel for purchase and/or size you up for a BC, regulator and wetsuit to rent.

### **Checklist**

This checklist will help you ensure that you have everything you need prior to class: (all gear listed below is *required* for your course)

- Mask, Fins and Snorkel
- BC, Regulator and Wetsuit
- Hood, Gloves
- Slate
- PADI Medical Statement

- PADI Safe Diving Practices Release
